Homework: The homework folder will be sent home on Fridays and should be returned on Tuesdays. Children will be given a Shared Activity to complete each week. Please do as little or as much as you can. The idea of these activities is for you to have a little peek into what we are learning in school.

Reading: Children are assessed in their phonics at the end of every ha-term. Children have been grouped by the progress they have made. Every child now has a green reading record book which is bought into school every day. Families are encouraged to read with their child 5 times over the week, please record this in your child's reading record.

Writing: The spring term is where we encourage writing to be developed. Encourage your child to write lists, cards, labels and shot captions e.g. It is a red bus, big dog, I am hot etc.

Mental Maths: Any counting, simple adding or taking away will really support the children's maths development.

Reading: Sound, word books, ditty sheets and books are changed every Tuesday and Friday. Green reading record books must be bought into school every day.

PE: Please send your child to school dressed in Alveston's uniform PE kit on Tuesdays (Forest School) and Wednesdays (PE).

Reception - Spring Curriculum 2025

Literacy

We will continue to teach daily phonics using Read, Write, Inc to develop sound awareness and writing skills. Children will continue to 'Fred talk, read the word' to develop 'Fred in your head'. They will build their knowledge of 'red words'. Writing will consolidate pencil grip, letter formation and conventions of a sentence (finger spaces, full stops and capital letters). Children will develop their writing through lists for an explorer, label a bear, write a Chinese New Year card, describe a dinosaur and many more.

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Maths

We continue to follow Mastering Number in Reception with focus on subitising, composition, counting, ordinality and cardinality. This term we learn how to count, recognise, write and use numbers up to 10 and start to use our number bonds. We will look at addition and

We will continue to develop children's vocabulary by introducing key vocabulary when learning about our world and dinosaurs. Children will share their own knowledge of places and facts. Children will listen and answer questions on fiction and non-fiction texts.	The children will continue their fine motor skills through pencil grip and funky fingers activities. Every week Mrs Newitt will take the children to Forest School where they will be learning about the world and out environment. In addition, every week we will do PE, where we will focus on apparatus, gymnastics and dance.	Activities will develop children's knowledge in an empathetic way, helping them develop respect and tolerance for the world around them. Children will develop self-regulation and develop their emotional vocabulary through the zones of regulation.

Our focus this term is out amazing world and this will include introductions to weather and climate, animals and habitats and change in state (water and ice). We will learn about the seven continents and their locations on the globe. We will look at the flag, traditions and foods. We will also look at where dinosaurs roamed the world.
